


Coach Spotlight: Robert Ha, La Quinta High School

Robert Ha, currently teaching English at La Quinta High School, is in his twelfth year of teaching. Eleven of those years (including this year) have also been spent serving students as an Academic Decathlon coach.

Early on in his teaching career, Robert was approached by the former La Quinta Academic Decathlon coach, Rob Weeg, with an opportunity to become the school's next coach. Looking to become more active on campus, Robert took the opportunity given to him to greater serve the students of La Quinta. Although a potentially overwhelming task, Weeg assured Robert that there was support from every direction from Weeg himself and from the coordinators at the county competition. Eleven years later Robert has seen his program thrive and grow.

La Quinta high school has a growing list of accomplishments, including first place Division 3 during the 2011 Orange County Academic Decathlon (OCAD) competition; a first place in Division 2

and a high bid to state during the 2012 OCAD competition, and a top-five placement in Division 1 of the 2015 OCAD competition, which led to their most recent bid to the state competition where they placed third in the Super Quiz Relay for Division 3. There have been numerous highlights and successes for his teams and students, but there is one accomplishment in particular that keeps Robert going as a coach: winning the first place overall team award in the OCAD competition.

Robert's favorite memory from his team's listed accomplishments was the moment when they qualified for the state competition while competing in Division 2 of OCAD. He reminisces, "We thought we had a good chance of winning Division 2 but we were all surprised when the announcement was made that we were headed to Sacramento!"

Robert is a believer that the power of the OCAD program at his school goes beyond the impact of winning awards and individual medals. He states, "I love watching a student's confidence grow when they participate in Decathlon." Being a program that students can participate in every year during their high school career, Robert has witnessed several of his students join the team as early as their freshman or sophomore year and really blossom into their own by the time they are seniors. As an advocate for the program, Robert shared "Academic Decathlon is more than just studying. It's about social growth. It's about learning how to be part of a team and finding what your role is on that team."

Beyond teaching English and coaching Academic Decathlon, Robert enjoys spending time with his family exploring and adventuring around Los Angeles and during outings at Disneyland. He is also an avid University of Maryland basketball fan and he enjoys trying out new restaurants.

Celebrating our Mission in Numbers!






of students reported that the program improved skills in *critical thinking*
