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OCAD Decathlete Spotlight: The Canyon Big Three

After two years of participation in the Academic Decathlon program, Canyon High School has staked claim to first place in the regional competition and has made waves at the state competition with a ninth place overall. The Canyon team has built its success on discipline, countless hours of studying, dedication to having fun as a team, and the leadership of three seniors who are all the embodiment of champion decathletes. These stellar decathletes represented Orange County at the national level by competing as individuals during the United States Academic Decathlon, held in Alaska this past April. Meet Akif Khan, Arian Kazerani, and Josh Shlegel.



After a very successful first year as coach for the Canyon team, AP Physics teacher, Khoa Dao, had to completely rebuild his team for the 2015-16 school year. Dao recruited three exceptional seniors who helped lead his team to the top spot in the OCAD rankings. Akif, Arian, and Josh joined Academic Decathlon because of their love of learning, the opportunity to better their study skills and work ethic, their chance to work as a team, and of course, because of their competitive spirits. Their team was on a rigorous preparation schedule, studying an average of 40-hours individually and as a team - yet doing so with both focus and fun. The success of the Canyon team, both at regionals and state, is indicative of their

commitment to each other and the leadership of Akif, Arian, and Josh. As individuals, these three senior classmen saw much success as well, earning medals at regional, state, and national levels. Akif earned a total of 20 medals in the Honor category, including a 1st place overall individual at regionals, four medals at state, and five medals at nationals. Arian earned a total of 13 medals in the Varsity category, including a 1st place overall individual at regionals and two medals at nationals. Josh earned a total of 8 medals in the Honor category, including a 6th place overall individual at regionals and two medals at nationals.

Beyond Academic Decathlon, the Canyon "Big Three" have kept busy with extra-curricular activities, have since graduated, and are now awarded with summer vacation, as they await their college careers. In the Fall, Akif will be attending U.C. Irvine, Arian will be at Irvine Valley College with plans to transfer to U.C. Berkeley, and Josh will be headed to U.C.L.A. 9th/10th Grade "JV" Competition Results

On May 21, 2016, 19 Orange County high schools participated in the 9th/10th grade "JV" Academic Decathlon, hosted on the campus of Aliso Niguel High School. Also known as "baby OCAD" to many coaches and student decathletes, the "JV" competition is a modified version the main Orange County Academic Decathlon program. Ninth and tenth grade students study an abridged version of the Academic Decathlon curriculum and participate in seven out of ten main events. These events include objective testing in art, literature, math, music, science, and social science; as well as an essay portion and a shortened speech component. In addition, teams participate in the live -audience Super Quiz Relay. Participants also compete for medals and top team honors, in addition to getting a flavor of the main Decathlon competition. The awards ceremony was held on June 3, at the OC Sheriff's Regional Training Academy. Let's take a look at our top teams for the 2016 "JV" Academic Decathlon!
