1. Planning ahead

Projects submitted for DSA approval beginning 1/1/2017 must conform to the 2016 California Building Standards Codes. Our Pre-checked PC designs conforming to the 2013 codes may be submitted through 6/30/2017 (Bulletin BU 16-03). Schedule an electronic back-check to prepare for future all-electronic plan review. DSA is actively preparing for a potential large increase in workload.

2. Higher project cost thresholds for DSA review exemptions

DSA Interpretation of Regulations IR A-10: Alterations and Reconstruction Projects-DSA Approval Exemption (Rev. 6/30/2016)

- \sim \$100.000 valuation and helow
- \$100,000 valuation and below
- \$225,000 valuation and below
 - > No work of a structural nature
 - No work regulated by Title 24 accessibility standards
 - > No work that triggers accessibility upgrades
 - > Work meets all fire/life safety standards

What is the problem?

- Earthquakes can shift or knock over file cabinets, bookcases, office equipment, refrigerators, vending machines, storage racks, etc.
- Improperly anchored components may be a hazard to life and property
- Many non-structural components are not required to be seismically anchored by the California Building Code.
