WebGrants

WebGrants is CSAC's web-based grant management platform. Through this portal, institutions can manage their Cal Grant roster, upload GPAs, and run reports. All organizations and institution types should utilize one of the forms below to request WebGrants access.

Do you have Access to Web Grants?

-"I don't upload GPAs so why do I need WebGrants access?" With WebGrants, you have the ability to see if students have successfully completed an application, successfully matched to their GPA and if they have been awarded a Cal Grant

-"We already have a counselor with WebGrants access"

There is no limit to the number of users your school can have! More end-users helps ensure better tracking of student success
